### Preceptorship Program in Advanced Periodontics and Dental Implants

The Department of Periodontology offers an intensive full-time one academic year Periodontology program for dentists graduated from US dental schools and holding a valid US dental state license who want to enhance their knowledge and skills in the field of Periodontology and Implant Dentistry. The preceptorship program involves didactic, clinical and/or research training.

The Program Includes:

- Lectures, seminars, and clinical conferences
- Evidence-based knowledge for clinical care and literature reviews
- Periodontics and Dental Implantology – following all phases of therapy

Preceptors are enrolled in didactic courses, seminars, case conferences and literature review offered in the Advanced Periodontology Graduate Program. The preceptor will have active participation in the graduate clinic initially assisting graduate students, and following the ongoing treatment. The preceptor may have the opportunity for hands-on clinical training depending on preceptor's progress in this program after approval by Periodontal Faculty and Program Director. The Division of Periodontology works closely with other divisions within the University of Oklahoma College of Dentistry to provide a broad exposure to interdisciplinary patient care.

The tuition is \$30,000 U.S dollars per academic year, due in two payments of \$15,000.00 before the fall academic semester and at the start of the spring academic semester. The preceptor will be responsible for all incidental fees, intraoral photography equipment, personal computer, health insurance and living expenses above and beyond the preceptorship tuition.

No funds, scholarships, loans or grants are available for this Preceptorship Program from the OU College of Dentistry.

After successful completion of the program, preceptors will receive a certificate confirming completion of a Preceptorship Program in Periodontology. This certificate is not as a specialty degree and does not guarantee acceptance in our three (3)-year Periodontal Graduate Program.
